New Troop Leader Checklist

1. Grab your calendar and talk to your interested parentsYou'll need to decide on:



- Meeting location, zip code and city
- Meeting frequency, day and start time
- Meeting start date (when you plan to start holding meetings)
- Grade(s) of girls you wish to include

2. Set up your new troop

• Fill out the <u>Troop Number Request Form</u>, one submission per troop: https://fs19.formsite.com/girlscoutsnorcal/form130/index.html



Register to be a volunteer; once we have your troop number request, you
will receive an email with a personal link and instructions to completing your
membership registration.

- Once registered, check your email for your background check invitation with screening link, as it expires in 72 hours (check Spam folder if you don't get a link within 24 hours of registration).
- You will receive an email with your background screening approval and new troop number assignment

3. Build your new troop
