# GSNorCal Service Unit Delegates - 2025 Election

Service unit delegates (age 14 and older) serve a one-year term as a key communication link between the GSNorCal Board of Directors and GSNorCal members. As a representative for their service unit and a voting member at GSNorCal's Annual Meeting, delegates share feedback they gathered from their service unit about key topics, provide input on our council's strategy, vote on bylaws amendments, discuss national proposals, and elect the GSNorCal Board of Directors.

From Article 1, Section 4 of GSNorCal's bylaws:

Each service unit shall be entitled to elect one or more delegates based on the total number of girls/youth registered in the service unit, as of September 30 of the year preceding the annual meeting.

In service units entitled to elect only one delegate, the delegate may be either an eligible girl/youth or an eligible adult.

In service units entitled to elect two or three delegates, one and only one shall be an eligible girl/youth. In the event that no eligible girls/youth all open position(s) may be filled by eligible adults.

### UNCONTESTED RACES

An **uncontested race** occurs when the number of delegate nominees within a service unit is equal to or less than the number of available delegate positions for that service unit, with adherence to the girl/youth and adult delegate number eligibility stated in GSNorCal's bylaws.

When there is a service unit with an uncontested race, the delegate nominee(s) for that service unit is automatically considered elected. They will **not** appear on election ballots and do **not** require votes. These service units and service units with no nominees are listed in the **Service Units with Uncontested Races** and **Service Units with No Nominees** sections found at the end of this Voter Guide.

## CONTESTED RACES

Nominees from 16 service units (SU112, 302, 307, 308, 309, 310, 321, 322, 323, 326, 332, 384, 625, 630, and 643) require votes due to more nominees than available delegate positions. Nominee bios are listed below.

If you are an eligible voter (registered and 14 years or older) from a service unit with a contested election, please review the nominee bios for **only** your service unit and **cast your vote January 6 -20, 2025** <u>using the voting ballot</u>.
