It requires completing a Journey, attending a Silver Award workshop and a Silver Take Action Project of approximately 50 hours. Though Council approval is not required for the project, it is required for any money-earning for the project. There is a final report that needs to be submitted to Council at the end of the project.

Step 2: Attend a Silver Award workshop	
Step 3: Identify issues you care about	
Step 4: Build your Girl Scout Cadette team or decide to go solo	
Step 5: Explore your community	
Step 6: Choose your Girl Scout Silver Take Action Project	
Step 7: Develop your project	
Step 8: Make a plan and put it into motion	
Step 9: Reflect, share your story and celebrate
