Daisy Girl Scout Law Bracelet

This bracelet can be a reminder for the girls as they learn the Girl Scout Law. Materials:

6" of stretchy bracelet string (depending on size of wrist) Pony beads (colors listed below) tape



Instructions: Put a piece of tape on the end of the string to prevent the beads from sliding off the other end. String the beads in the order listed below. When finished, carefully remove the tape from the end of the string, and tie the 2 ends together. You can use extra or fewer white or silver beads to make the bracelet bigger or smaller depending on the size of the girl's wrist. This activity can be tied into any of the Girl Scout Daisy Leadership Journeys, and the girls can use it to help them memorize and recite the Girl Scout Law.

Light Blue - Lupe	Honest and Fair The sky is blue and always fair, it rains on everyone or shines on everyone.
Yellow - Sunny	Friendly and Helpful Yellow is cheerful and friendly and the color of the sun which helps all living things grow.
Light Green - Zinni	considerate and caring Light Green reminds us of the tiny new plants that sprout in the spring and require our consideration and caring to grow into healthy plants.
Red - Tula	Courageous and Strong Red is the color of blood. It represents strength and bravery.
Orange - Mari	Responsible for what I say and do Orange is the Color of fire, it reminds us to always be responsible, for fire can consume everything in its path if we do not use it responsibly.
Purple - Gloria	Respect myself and others Purple is the Color of nobility and honor and it commands respect.
Magenta - Gerry	Respect Authority Magenta is a combination of red and blue, the colors of our flag. It commands our respect.
Green - Clover	Use resources wisely Green is the color of the grass and the trees and it reminds us to be careful to keep our earth green.
Rose - Rosie	Make the world a better placeRose reminds us of the beautiful flower and to always find beauty in the world and try to leave it better then we found it.
Violet - Vi	Be a sister to every Girl Scout, just like this flower that grows in groups, we grow best surrounded by our sister Girl Scouts.
